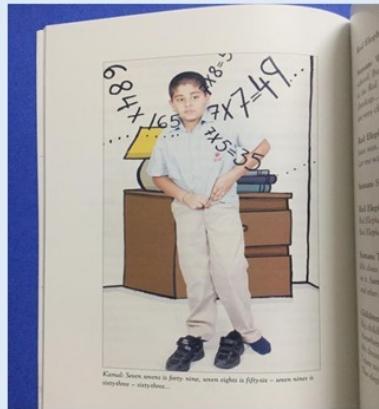


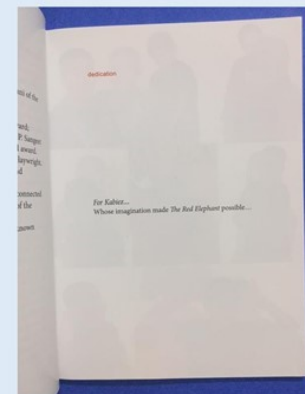
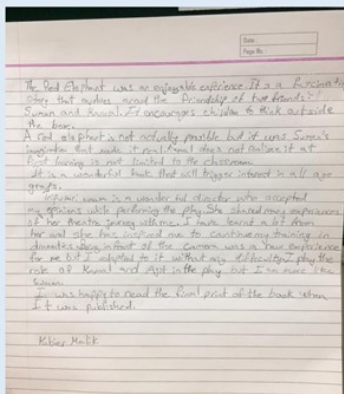
# A Young Student's Endeavours Earn Him A Place On The Cover Of A Book!
